Vowels

'e'as in 'bed' (peng)

'u'as in 'put' (mum or munyuk)

' a' as in 'path' (manyə or thathər)

'I'as in 'hit' (pili or tyina)

'a 'as in 'the' (manya or thathar)

'o' as in 'on' (woyi or Kolety)

'ty' is pronounced 'ch' as in 'church' (tyina or tyuluk)

'ng' is pronounced 'ng' as in 'ring' (peng or ngapa)

'th' is pronounced 'd' as in 'dark' (thathar is pronounced <u>dar-d</u>'r)
